

### **Key Highlights**

#### ➤ **Facing the Interview:**

- **Common Interview Questions:** Key questions like "Tell us about yourself" and "Why do you want to work for this company?" should be answered confidently, using personal experiences like internships or college projects.
- **Dealing with Nerves:** Techniques such as mock interviews and deep breathing exercises help manage anxiety and improve confidence.
- **Expert Advice:** Women should confidently highlight their achievements and balance technical skills with soft skills like teamwork and communication.

#### ➤ **Resume Making:**

- **Crafting an Impactful Resume:** A resume should be concise, clear, and tailored to the job description, highlighting key sections like personal summary, education, skills, and work experience.
- **Highlighting Achievements:** Focus on academic achievements, internships, and transferable skills, using bullet points and quantifying accomplishments where possible.
- **Professional Formatting:** Resumes should be well-organized with clean fonts and consistent formatting, avoiding unnecessary graphics or colors.
- **Expert Advice:** Tailor resumes for each job, include relevant experiences, and keep it concise and focused.

➤ **Group Discussions (GD):**

- Understanding Group Discussions: GDs assess teamwork, leadership, and communication skills, focusing on how candidates interact, share ideas, and respect differing opinions.
- Effective Participation: Women should balance speaking up with active listening, contributing valuable points without dominating the conversation.
- How to Lead without Overpowering: Take leadership when necessary, guiding discussions constructively and maintaining a positive attitude.
- Expert Advice: Practice listening, avoid interrupting, and demonstrate teamwork and leadership abilities through collaborative communication.

➤ **The Role of Body Language:**

- Power of Non-Verbal Communication: Posture, eye contact, and facial expressions are key in conveying confidence and professionalism.
- Positive Body Language: Women should maintain a confident posture, make eye contact, use hand gestures to emphasize points, and offer a firm handshake to create a positive impression.
- Being Aware of Nervous Habits: Avoid fidgeting, crossing arms, or avoiding eye contact, as these can signal insecurity.
- Expert Advice: Maintain strong posture, use eye contact effectively, and avoid distracting body language like slouching or fidgeting.

The guest lecture on "Campus to Corporate" provided invaluable insights and practical advice for students transitioning into the professional world. The speaker highlighted that the key to success lies in a combination of preparation, confidence, and soft skills.
